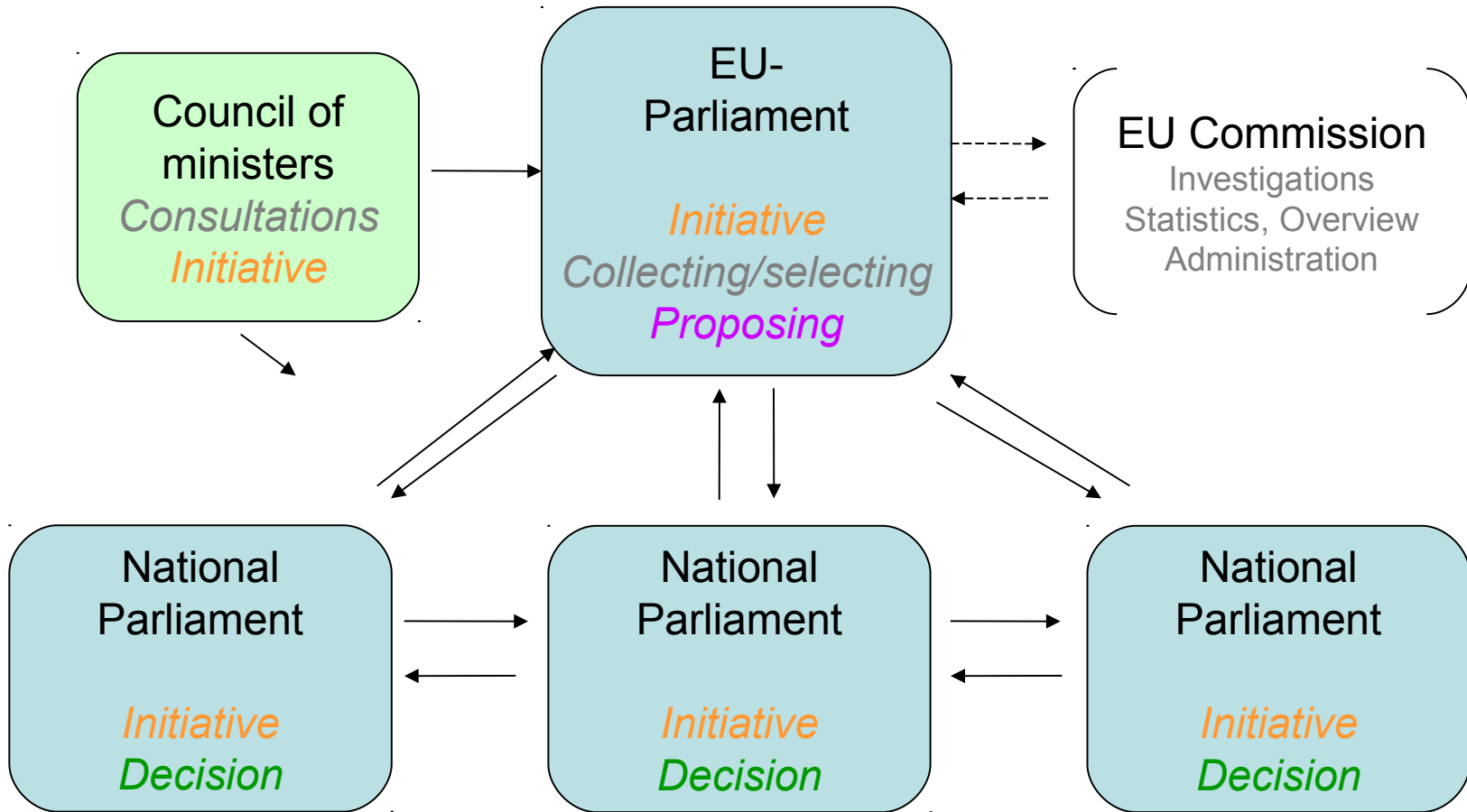


Supported interparlamentarian co-operation



When national parliament groups want to convey proposals to all the other parliaments, the proposals are sent to the EU parliament. The EU-parliamentarians can also put proposals as can the ministers in the Council. The EU parliament picks out "the best" proposals through voting. These will then be voted upon in all participating countries. Representatives of the proposals can take part in the debates, both in the EU parliament and in the national parliaments. The nations that accept the proposals implement them, others can follow later if the outcomes are proven good.

Possible delegations to the IP

- Can concern a single decision or a special topic
- Partial delegation – can be overruled nationally with a qualified majority
- Always limited in time – are regularly tested, can be prolonged

Possible details

- A certain number of parliamentarians are needed to bring a proposal to IP, maybe from different countries
- A certain number of countries are needed to make a ministerial proposal to the IP
- Proposals to modify present EU-legislation is always brought to the IP
